MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Dear member,

It's that time of year, and we're all doing the last-minute Christmas shopping. ISME has launched its traditional Shop Local Campaign, and we ask all members, as citizens and as member companies, to keep some spend locally. We also encourage members who are considering a staff bonus to use the ISME Gift Card affinity: as well as being really appreciated by staff, it is also tax efficient for your business.

This is a particularly busy and difficult time of year for our retailers in the prevention of theft. Retail theft is always evolving, and 'yamming,' 'steaming' or 'rushing' are tactics whereby groups of people mount co-ordinated attacks on stores, sometimes via social media.

A difficulty with tackling retail theft is the state of our defamation laws. There is no 'safe script' for shopkeepers to use with individuals they suspect of theft, i.e. a formula of words which will proof them against an assertion by a plaintiff of a claim of defamation. The best advice from those who advise shop keepers is to identify those known shoplifters and refuse them entry to the store.

ISME has also advocated that Ireland changes its defamation act, essentially to introduce the reforms the UK brought in some years back to stop 'libel shopping.' Our submission to Minster Flanagan is available here. Minister Flanagan has indicated that the defamation act needs a 'searching review' but he has given no indication of legislative reform as yet.

The EU Anti-Money Laundering Directive requires all EU Member States to put into national law provisions requiring corporate and legal entities to obtain accurate, current information on their beneficial owner(s) in their own internal beneficial ownership register. The deadline for notifying your company's beneficial owners to the Companies Registration Office Entities was 22nd November, but approximately 30% of companies have failed to do so. The CRO will be issuing warning letters to companies which have failed to comply very soon. If you haven't registered the beneficial ownership of your company, you'll find the process on the Register of Beneficial Ownership website. Don't delay!

Please don't take your foot off the pedal on Brexit preparations. By a narrowing margin, a Tory majority is the likeliest outcome in the UK general election, and this will most probably bring a 'customs Brexit' by the end of 2020. 
Shop Local, Buy Irish


Q3'19 Business Trends Report

2019 - THE YEAR IN REVIEW

January

ISME Introduces HR Webinars. In January 2019 ISME introduced its new series of webinars that are designed to assist with key people management issues. They are designed to address the fundamental processes that managers face on a daily basis. In 2020, we will expand the series to support employers in reviewing and developing company culture.

Minimum Wage Increase. On 1st January the minimum wage increased to €9.80 per hour.

February

ISME HR survey issued. ISMEs first HR survey was conducted and results are available here.

March

Miscellaneous Provisions Act. In March 2019 one of the most significant employment law updates of recent times occurred. It covered topics such as 'zero-hour contracts', banding of hours and minimum terms of employment as well as introducing stiff penalties for breaches of it's guidelines. April

Gender Pay Gap Bill Launched. While the legislation is still some time away the launch of the Gender Pay Gap Bill raised awareness of the issue and focused a lot of employer's attention on the equitable status of their remuneration policies.

May


CJEU Outcome Underlined the Importance of Recording Employee Working Time. Although the Organisation of Working Act already covered the topic, landmark legislation on the continent established a clear requirement for employers to record working time of employees. Luckily Irish legislation was already leading the way with regard to this topic!

<u>June</u>

Construction Sector Travel Time Rejected. During a review of travel time in the construction sector, the adjudicator noted that to impose such a cost on employers would effectively result in a 12% hike in salary and refused the motion.

<u>July</u>

New ISME HR Website Launched. ISME redesigned the HR section of the members website to make it more user friendly. Please check it out here.



August

First WRC event at ISME. In partnership with the Workplace Relations Commission, ISME launched a series of workshops designed to inform employers on the function of the WRC and the steps required to maintain compliance. This series will continue into 2020 so be sure to check out the ISME Roadshow calendar.

September

1st September – Update to the Parental Leave Act. There was an entitlement increase of 18 weeks to 22 weeks and the qualifying age of the child increased from eight to 12 years.



<u>October</u>

Budget 2020 maintains the Minimum Wage at the current rate of €9.80.

Launch of ISME Wellness. ISME has introduced a new members-only service, ISME Wellness. This provides employers the opportunity to provide their employees with support services to their employees and their families. The service includes counselling sessions, financial, legal & general health advice with trained professionals and access to a wealth of supporting information.

November

1st November – Parental Leave and Benefits Act is introduced. This act provides new parents with two weeks paid leave in the first 52 weeks after the birth/adoption of a child. The leave is supported by the Department of Social Welfare contribution, but there is no obligation on employers to supplement the payment.

11th November – The Supreme Court upheld the Court of Appeals position in the McKelvey case. This ruling established an important precedent for the right to representation during 'disciplinary' and 'grievance proceedings. This confirmed that employees are not entitled to have legal representation present during internal procedures unless it is on a point of law or the case is particularly complex.

The employees right to representation is not impacted by this. ISME still recommend that employees have access to a colleague, Trade Union official or a Citizens Information representative (once they confirm they have no legal representation or are not being represented by a solicitor.

December



DECEMBER TAX UPDATE

December	Dividend Withholding Tax
14 th	Due date for payment and filing of returns of withholding tax on dividends paid by companies in November 2019.
	Capital Gains Tax
15 th	Payment due on disposals made between 1st January 2019 and 30th November 2019.
	Income Tax
23 rd	Payment of PAYE/PRSI/USC/LPT deductions for November 2019 (ROS filers).
	Corporation Tax
23 rd	Company year-end 31st January 2020: Preliminary tax due, minimum 90% of total liability for the year. Small companies can pay 100% of previous year's liability.
	Company year-end 31^{st} March 2019: Payment of balance of corporation tax and filing of corporation tax return (ROS filers).
	Company Secretarial
28 th	Filing of Annual Returns dated 30 th November 2019.
	Corporation Tax
31 st	Company year-end 30 th June 2018: Close companies with undistributed profits may have to make a distribution by this date to avoid surcharge.
	Company year-end 31^{st} March 2019: Filing of 'Return of third-party information' (Form 46G).
	Company Secretarial
31 st	Company year-end 31 st March 2019 : Final date for holding Annual General Meeting and latest possible Annual Return date for 2019.

SME VAT INFORMATION EXCHANGE SYSTEM (VIES)

VIES provides a mechanism whereby checks can be made in each Member State on the validity of claims to zero-rating. It helps to detect unreported movements of zero-rated goods between Member States.

Where a VAT registered person supplies goods or services to business customers registered for VAT in another EU jurisdiction, that person is required to complete a statistical return known as a VAT Information Exchange System (VIES) return. This is Ireland's version of the EC Sales List/ESL.

The return does not extend to the receipt of supplies of goods or service by a VAT registered person. There is no threshold for the requirement to register for VIES, but there are some limited exceptions to this.

VIES returns are required to be filed on a monthly or quarterly basis. Monthly filing is required only where trader's reportable supplies of goods are relatively significant. For traders that have only reportable supplies of services, returns can be filed quarterly irrespective of the value of the supplies made.

In practice, such returns must be filed electronically on or before the 23rd day of the month following the end of a monthly/quarterly period. For example, the quarter 1 VIES return is required to be filed on or before 23rd April.

VIES returns normally contain the following information:

- · The trader's VAT number
- The recipient's foreign VAT number
- The total value of supplies made to each customer
- The indicator 'S' in the flag column where the supply relates to services
- The indicator 'T' in the flag column where goods were the subject of the triangulation procedure

Revenue and VIES, Intrastat and Mutual Assistance (VIMA) monitor the figures declared in boxes E1 and ES1 of trader's periodic VAT returns to establish whether they should be registered for VIES. Despite this, the onus rests on the taxpayer to determine whether they should be registered.

It is common for tax authorities to collaborate on a cross-border basis in an effort to prevent, deter and detect fraudulent behaviour.

Intrastat

Intrastat is the system for collecting statistics on the movement of goods, not services, between Member States of the EU. The general concept of intra-EU trade statistics is independent from the ownership of the goods. It concerns only their physical movement.
