Brexit: preparing for change

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Current State of Play

- The United Kingdom (UK) is to leave the European Union (EU) on 31st Jan;
- Transition period will commence. During this period, all EU rules and regulations will continue to apply to the UK;
- The Withdrawal Agreement allows for the UK and EU to decide by July to extend the transition period. This will become clearer in June;
- EU/UK future relationship negotiations expected to begin in late Feb/early March.



Revenue's Key Messages

If you import or export products from or to the UK or move products through the UK landbridge. You will need to;

- **Register for customs.** You can do this by getting an Economic Operators Registration and Identification (EORI) number;
- **Decide who will submit your customs declarations.** Customs formalities will apply post-Brexit when trading in goods with the UK. You, or an agent acting on your behalf, must have the facility to submit electronic customs declarations to Revenue;
- **Know the key data required for a customs declaration.** These include commodity codes, customs value of your goods & origin of your goods;
- Assess whether certain **customs authorisations and simplifications** could assist your trading model post-Brexit.



Infrastructure Updates

- Temporary infrastructure was provided in advance of the ‘no deal’ deadline. OPW now have extra time to deliver additional;
- Priority is providing the additional infrastructure which will assist goods to flow more freely;
- Will be separate areas for Transit & Seal Checks and Physical Exams;
- We are continuing our IT developments and will be developing a logistics envelope similar to what is being used in France.



Authorisations & Simplifications

Depending on your business model, there are a number of ways you can make your interaction with Revenue easier in the future EU-UK trading environment.

Businesses should assess whether customs authorisations and simplifications could assist their trading model post Brexit.

Authorised Economic Operator (AEO) – currently there are 252 AEOs issued.



Authorisations & Simplifications

Entry in the Declarant's Records (EIDR) - there are 28 EIDR Authorisations currently active.

Simplified declaration procedure - 34 Simplified Declaration Authorisations currently active.

Inward Processing Procedure – 176 authorisations in place

Outward Processing Procedure – 7 authorisations in place



Authorisations & Simplifications

Warehousing Procedure – currently 99 authorisations.

End-use – currently 39 authorisations.

Transit – currently 75 Authorised Consignors and 64 Authorised Consignees

Applications for authorisations/simplifications can be made electronically using the Customs Decision System (CDS).

Comprehensive Guarantees are required for all authorisations.
