MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Dear member,

At time of writing, the Government is looking very closely at public events given the spread of the Coronavirus. We brought out <u>advice</u> for businesses on how to prepare in February, but it is important for people to maintain a sense of proportion: 80-120 Irish people die every year from the normal winter flu. Coronavirus is more serious, and the population has not been vaccinated against it, but it is still a naturally occurring flu event. Your business should at this stage put together a contingency plan to deal with Coronavirus, and the Department of Business and Enterprise has a simple template available <u>here</u>.

General Election 2020 was inconclusive, but it's important we make an impression early on with our new TDs. Small business has been lost in the noise about housing and health, despite the fact that almost 70% of private sector workers are employed by SMEs. It is important that you make your voice heard locally with your TD. If you don't know who s/he is, you can check your constituency representative here.

2020 was the first time that ISME was represented on the Industrial and Commercial nominating panel for the Seanad Éireann elections. On the basis of his commitment to small business, the fact that he wrote the Perjury Bill for outgoing Senator Padraig O'Céidigh, and his determination to address the insurance issue if elected, ISME nominated Councillor James Geoghegan to the panel. We wish him well as he canvasses TDs and councillors.

I want to thank all of you who responded to our survey on captive insurers. 79% of respondents were unhappy with their current level of insurance premium, and 88% were willing to participate in captive insurance entities! We will be sharing the results with like-minded trade associations and with the Alliance for Insurance reform. Stay tuned for further updates!

The ISME Roadshows are back. Along with useful updates for business, we've added a 'pitch-your-business' slot this year, which went down a storm in Liffey Valley in January. Increases in commercial vacancy rates recorded

The national commercial vacancy rate stood at 13.3% in Q4 2019, 0.1pp higher than the same period in Q4 2018. Sligo, at 18.9%, was the county with the highest commercial vacancy rate. The five counties with the highest vacancy rates were all located in Connacht, a sign of the prominent east-west divide in terms of commercial activity. ISME has released its quarterly Bank Watch survey for Q4'19. The results show a decrease in loan refusal rates, decreasing from 58% to 19%, although 44% of respondents reported being only partially successful with their request. Due date for payment and filing of returns of withholding tax on dividends paid by companies in February 2020.

PAYE/PRSI

23rd Payment of PAYE/PRSI deductions for February 2020 (ROS filers).

VAT

23rd Payment of January/February 2020 VAT liability and filing of related VAT return (ROS filers).

Corporation Tax

Company year-end 30th April 2020: Preliminary tax due, minimum 90% of total liability for the year. Small companies can pay 100% of previous year's liability (ROS filers).

Company year-end 30th June 2019: Payment of balance of corporation tax and filing of corporation tax return (ROS filers).

Company Secretarial

28th Filing of Annual Returns dated 29th February 2020.

Corporation Tax

Company year-end 30th September 2018: Close companies with undistributed profits may have to make a distribution by this date to avoid surcharge.

Company year-end 30th June 2019: Filing of 'Return of third-party information' (Form 46G).

Company Secretarial

Company year end 30th June 2019: Final date for holding Annual General Meeting and latest possible Annual Return date for 2020.

Income Tax

Deadline for claiming Separate Assessment for 2020. Deadline for Nominating Assessable Spouse or Nominated Civil Partner for 2020.



ROS Extended Pay and File - Deadline 2020

Revenue has confirmed that the extended ROS pay and file deadline for 2019 Form 11 Income Tax returns and taxpayers liable to Capital Acquisitions Tax is Thursday 12th November 2020. This extended deadline applies only if the relevant returns and the appropriate tax payments are submitted via ROS. Otherwise the required date to submit both returns and payments is no later than 31st October 2020.

According to Revenue e Brief No: 009/20

For customers who file the 2019 Form 11 Return and make the appropriate payment through ROS for:

- Preliminary Tax for 2020
- Income Tax balance due for 2019
- the due date is extended to Thursday 12th November 2020.

For beneficiaries who receive gifts or inheritances with valuation dates in the year ended 31st August 2020 and who make CAT Return and the appropriate payment through ROS, the due date is also extended to Thursday 12th November 2020.

To qualify for the extension, customers must both pay and file through ROS. Where only one of these actions is completed through ROS, the extension does not apply and the required date to submit both returns and payments is no later than 31st October 2020.

No P60s for employees for 2019

Employees and directors will not receive a P60 for 2019. Instead an Employment Detail Summary is available to view and download in myAccount. This summary replaces P60 and shows pay and statutory deductions for the year as reported by employers or pension providers. It is like the information that was stated on the P60. It can be used in the same way as a P60 was previously used, for example, it can be provided to third parties as proof of income. More details are available on the Revenue website.

VAT EXEMPTION ON CERTAIN MEDICAL DIAGNOSTIC SERVICES

Treatment of Income

Payments to director of Irish incorporated companies are subject to the Schedule E charge to Irish Income Tax and to deductions at source under the PAYE system. More information is contained in Revenue Tax and Duty Part 42.04.61. The legislation (section 112 Taxes Consolidation Act 1997) provides two treatments for directors depending if the individual is a proprietary director (holds at least 15% of the company's shares) or a non-proprietary director.

General Treatment

Since 1st January 2018, income from an office/employment is chargeable to tax on a receipts basis. This means that the income is subject to tax, USC and PRSI when it is received, regardless of when it was earned. Income received by a proprietary director is still taxed on an earnings basis. Employers must, however, operate PAYE on the director's salary at the time of payment and report this payment to Revenue on or before the date it is paid. More information on employers' PAYE obligations can be found in Revenue's Tax and Duty Manual Part 42.04.35s.
